



## Retreat: Disentangling Heidegger on Technology

Buchnerhof (Alto Adige), 16th-23rd June 2024

Heidegger's work provides the background for much contemporary philosophy of technology. At the same time, his account of technology as our fundamental mode of unconcealment is notoriously difficult to make sense of. For Heidegger, technology becomes a central piece within his philosophical project. It is the completion of metaphysics, the final step on the road towards the forgetfulness of Being – and yet it also somehow provides the ground for an entirely new and different way of thinking.

To address this ambiguity at the centre of Heidegger's thought, we aim to bring together scholars and graduate students working on his later philosophy. During the week-long retreat, the participants will have the opportunity to present their work to the rest of the group. In addition, there will be time for more informal discussions, for example during hikes through the Italian Alps.

The retreat will be organised by Jonathan Krude and Mark Wrathall from the University of Oxford. Thanks to the generous support of the Elisabeth and Helmut Uhl Stiftung, accommodation and board at the Buchnerhof will be provided to all participants.
